| ARUNDEL, Ford, West Sussex | Sussex Gold (4.2% ABV) | A light golden ale with a malty, fruity flavour and a little hop in the finish. | |
| BALLARDS, Nyewood, West Sussex | Golden Bine (3.8% ABV) | Golden in colour with a light, floral flavour and aroma; available from March to April. | |
| BANK TOP, Bolton, Lancashire | Gold Digger (4.0% ABV) | Golden coloured, with a citrus aroma, grapefruit and a touch of spiciness on the palate and a hoppy citrus finish. | |
| BARTRAMS, Bury St. Edmunds | Bees Knees (4.2% ABV) | Orange/amber beer with an aroma of hops and flowers, light body is sweetened by honey. | |
| BARTRAMS, Bury St. Edmunds | Jester Quick One (4.4% ABV) | A darker than average best bitter that is more malty than hoppy, with hints of fruit in the aroma. | |
| BARUM, Pilton, Devon | Breakfast (5.0% ABV) | Mid-brown in colour with a balanced aroma, slightly sweet taste with overtones of Coca-cola leading to fruitiness. A bitter cherry finish. | |
| BATH ALES, Bristol | Barnstomer (4.5% ABV) | Malt (roast & chocolate) hop and fruit aroma. Mid-brown, it is well balanced and smooth with a complex malty and bitter dry finish. | |
| BEARTOWN, Congleton, Cheshire | Ginger Bear (4.0% ABV) | The flavours from the malt and hops blend with the added bite from the root ginger to produce a quenching finish. | |
| BERROW, Berrow, Somerset | Winter S'Port (4.7% ABV) | A special brew produced to help raise funds for Berrow F.C, following their recent fire; to replace the uninsured football kit. | |
| BLINDMANS, | Mine Beer (4.2% ABV) | A copper-coloured ale with full body, leading to a long finish. Fresh, hoppy aroma. | |
| BOGGART HOLE, Clough, Manchester | Angel Hill (4.2% ABV) | A premium golden pale ale with an aromatic explosion of flavour - for the true bitter drinker. | |
| BOGGART HOLE, Clough, Manchester | Dark Side (4.4% ABV) | A porter with a smooth roast finish and subtle hop aftertaste. | |
| BRANDON, Brandon, Suffolk | Rusty Bucket (4.0% ABV) | Based on a traditional brew; smooth on the palate, but surprisingly fruity. | |

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| BRANSCOMBE VALE, Branscombe, Devon | Draymans (4.2% ABV) | A mid-brown beer with hop and caramel notes, and a lingering finish. | |
| BRECONSHIRE, Brecon, Powys | Golden Valley (4.2% ABV) | An aroma of hops, fruit and malt leads to similar, balanced flavour with a good building bitterness. A lasting hoppy bitterness completes the ale. | |
| BRIDGE OF ALLAN, Bridge of Allan, Stirlingshire | Glencoe Wild Oat Stout (4.5% ABV) | A sweetish organic stout, surprisingly not dark in colour. Malt and roast is balanced by fruit and finished with a hint of hop. Suitable for vegans. | |
| BUSHY'S, Mount Murray, Isle of Man | Export Bitter (3.8% ABV) | An aroma of pale malt and hops introduces you to a beautifully hoppy bitter beer; despite hop dominance malt is also evident. Fresh and clean tasting. | |
| CAINS, Liverpool | Formidale Ale (5.0% ABV) | A bitter and hoppy beer with a good dry aftertaste. Sharp, clean and dry. | |
| CAIRNGORM, Aviemore, Inverness-shire | Black Gold (4.4% ABV) | Award-winning Scottish dark stout with a rich dark colour, smooth sweetness and underlying roast barley hints. | |
| CANAVAN, Liverpool | Dublin to Liverpool Stout (4.5% ABV) | A dry stout. The brewery was launched on 2nd February by 25 year-old Tony Canavan who claims to be world's youngest brewery owner. | |
| CHERITON, Cheriton, Hampshire | Diggers Gold (4.6% ABV) | A full-bodied, well-balanced golden best bitter. A glorious hoppy, grapefruit aroma leads to a strong hoppy bite in the flavour. | |
| CLEARWATER, Torrington, Devon | Cavalier (4.0% ABV) | Mid-brown full bodied bitter with a burnt rich malt aroma and taste. Leading to a bitter finish. | |
| CONWY, Conwy, N.W. Wales | Special (4.5% ABV) | A dark premium bitter based on Telford Porter; gorgous and mellow with roast caramelised flavours producing a perfectly balanced dark beer. | |
| COPPER DRAGON, Skipton, North Yorkshire | Golden Pippin (3.9% ABV) | This straw-coloured beer has an intense citrus aroma and flavour, characteristic of American Cascade hops. Dry, astringent aftertaste. | |
| COUNTRYLIFE, The Big Sheep, Abbotsham, Devon | Country Bumpkin (6.0% ABV) | Dark, and slightly sweet. | |

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| CRONDALL, Crondall, Surrey | Crondall's Best (4.0% ABV) | This is a light-straw coloured bitter. | |
| CRONDALL, Crondall, Surrey | Mitchells Dream (4.5% ABV) | Named in honour of RJ Mitchell who designed the famous Spitfire aircraft. This beer is light in colour, with hops evident. | |
| CROUCH VALE, South Woodham Ferrers, Essex | Essex Boys (3.5% ABV) | Amber light bitter with a spicy citrus aroma and a building dry aftertaste. | |
| DANELAW, Chellaston, Derby | Danegeld (3.8% ABV) | A pale, hoppy session bitter with a dry finish. | |
| DARK STAR, Ansty, West Sussex | American Pale Ale (4.7% ABV) | A very hoppy pale bitter brewed with American brewer's yeast and American hops. | |
| DARK STAR, Ansty, West Sussex | Best (4.0% ABV) | Red-brown in colour; roast rye malt dominates the aroma and taste. | |
| DARK STAR, Ansty, West Sussex | Hophead (3.8% ABV) | Hops dominate the aroma and taste of this pale bitter, which leads to a lingering dry finish. A multi-award winner! | |
| DARK STAR, Ansty, West Sussex | Oatmeal Stout (4.5% ABV) | Jet black with rich caramel and smooth malty flavours, with dryness and some liquorice coming through the taste. Long bitter finish. | |
| DARWIN, Sunderland, Tyne & Wear | Ghost Ale (4.1% ABV) | A light and hoppy ale with rich Cascade bitterness and dry aftertaste. An excellent session bitter which lasts and lingers in the memory. | |
| DERBY, Derby | Oberburgermeister (5.2% ABV) | | |
| E & S ELLAND, Eiland, West Yorkshire | Eiland Back (4.6% ABV) | A pale premium bitter with grapefruit and citrus top notes in aroma and a bitter yet fruity palate from the use of American hops. | |
| ELGOODS, Wisbech, Cambridgeshire | P agent Ale (4.3% ABV) | A premium beer, with a good aroma of hops and malt, giving a well-balanced bitter-sweet flavour and a satisfying finish. | |
| ELVEDEN, Elveden, Norfolk. | Elveden Stout (5.0% ABV) | Brewed on the Elveden estate, home of the Earl of Iveagh (Guinness). An Irish stout traditionally-matured in oak whiskey casks. | |

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| FACERS, Salford, Gtr. Manchester | Twin City (3.3% ABV) | This mild is red/brown in colour with a fruity nose. Complex with a warm spiciness, adding to roast, caramel and fruit flavours. Short malty finish. | |
| FERNANDES, Wakefield, West Yorkshire | Bally Moss (4.6% ABV) | An Irish red-ale; smooth and malty with a hoppy aftertaste. Named after the famous racehorse. | |
| FOX, Heacham, Norfolk | Branthill Pioneer (5.0% ABV) | Malty, fresh aroma. Hops are present in the background. Drop of Real Norfolk (4.1% ABV) | |
| FOX, Heacham, Norfolk | Drop of Real Norfolk (4.1% ABV) | Yellow-coloured with a tart fruity aroma and flavour. Bitterness comes through the taste prior to the tangy aftertaste. | |
| FOWLERS, Prestonpans, Lothian | IPA (4.1% ABV) | Amber-coloured with a hoppy aroma, well-balanced malt/hop flavour, hoppy finish. | |
| FRONT STREET, Fakenham, Norfolk | Callums Ale (4.3% ABV) | A red-brown bitter with a fruity aroma. The taste is malty and toasty with some balancing bitterness and a hoppy finish. | |
| FUZZY DUCK, Preesall, Lancashire | Stout (4.0% ABV) | This stout is from a brewery that is being run as hobby from a private house! | |
| FYNE ALES, Cairndow, Argyll | Maverick (4.2% ABV) | Smooth, nutty session beer with a sweet fruity finish. | |
| GARTON, Driffeld, East Yorkshire | Stunned Mullet (4.0% ABV) | A premium quality bitter with a deep red hue. | |
| GOACHERS, Tovil, Kent | Crown Imperial Stout (4.5% ABV) | A classic Irish-style stout with a clean palate and satisfying aftertaste from Kent Fuggles hops. | |
| GRAND UNION, Hayes, Middlesex | Gold (4.2% ABV) | A floral hop fragrance changes to a citrus hop character on the palate, followed with a bitter-sweet finish. | |
| HADRIAN & BORDER, Newcastle upon Tyne. | Flotsam (4.0% ABV) | Bronze coloured with a citrus bitterness and a distinctive floral aroma. | |
| HAMMERPOT, Hammerpot, West Sussex | Woodcote Bitter (4.5% ABV) | First available at the SBF/A tangy amber bitter with a pleasant dry finish. Brewed with English Northdown hops. | |
| HAMPSHIRE, Romsey, Hampshire | Porky & Best (4.5% ABV) | A classic Best Bitter, rich copper coloured and well balanced, full malt and hop flavours. Refreshing and easy drinking. | |

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| HARVEY, Lewes, East Sussex | Hadlow Bitter (3.5% ABV) | This is a notably hoppy light bitter (the old PA recipe) using hops grown in the Hadlow area of Kent. It has a long dry finish. | |
| HARVEY, Lewes, East Sussex | 1859 Porter (4.8% ABV) | This is brewed to a 1859 recipe, coffee and hop notes are dominant in the taste and the long finish. | |
| HARVEY, Lewes, East Sussex | Sussex Best Bitter (4.0% ABV) | This is a full-bodied brown bitter. A hoppy aroma leads to a good malt hop balance, and a dry aftertaste. CAMRA's Champion Best Bitter 2005. | |
| HAWKSHEAD, Hawkshead, Cumbria | Lakeland Gold (4.4% ABV) | A hoppy bitter golden ale with complex fruit flavours from the blending of a modern English hop First Gold with the American Cascade. | |
| HERRIDEAN Stornaway, Lewis | Celtic Black Ale (3.9% ABV) | A dark ale full of flavour, balancing an aromatic hop combined with a subtle bite and a pleasantly caramel aftertaste. | |
| HIDDEN, Salisbury, Wiltshire | Hidden Fantasy (4.6% ABV) | A straw-coloured beer with an aroma of sweet malt. The taste is of underlying fruity sweetness with a strong dry finish. | |
| HIGH HOUSE, Matten, Northumberland | Auld Hemp (3.8% ABV) | Tawny-coloured ale with malt and fruit flavours and a good bitter finish. | |
| HOPDAEMON, Newnham, Kent | Golden Braid (3.7% ABV) | Pale-mid gold in colour, citric fruit sweetness with balancing hops. A refreshing, quaffing session ale. | |
| HOUSTON, Houston, Renfrewshire. | Carls Beer (3.9% ABV) | A brewer's "mickey-take" of Carlsberg lager; light in colour and malty. | |
| HUMPTY DUMPTY, Reedham, Norfolk | Humpty Dumpty Ale (4.1% ABV) | Amber coloured with an overtly hoppy nose and grainy feel. The balance of this brew is definitely on the bitter side. Underlying sweetness fades to leave a long, dry finish. | |
| ICEN1, Ickburgh, Norfolk | Elveden Forest Gold (3.9% ABV) | A golden-coloured ale delicately finished by Brewers Gold hops. Thetford Forest Mild (3.6% ABV) | |
| ICEN1, Ickburgh, Norfolk | Thetford Forest Mild (3.6% ABV) | A black-coloured, traditional mild. | |
| INVERALMOND, Inveralmond, Perth. | Ossian's Ale (4.1% ABV) | Well-balanced best bitter with a dry finish. This full-bodied amber ale is dominated by fruit and hop with a bitter-sweet character. | |

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| ISLE OF MULL, Tobermory, Isle of Mull. | MacCaig's Foily (4.2% ABV) | Mid brown in colour with malt throughout, some bitter-sweet fruit flavour, a dry oyster malt finish. | |
| ITCHEN VALLEY, Airsted, Hampshire | Pure Gold (4.8% ABV) | An aromatic, hoppy golden bitter. Initial grapefruit flavours lead to a dry, bitter finish that leaves you wanting more. | |
| KELBURN, Barhead, East Renfrewshire | Carte Blanche (5.0% ABV) | A golden full-bodied ale with a dry aftertaste. | |
| KEMPTOWN, Brighton & Hove | Old Grumpy (6.5% ABV) | Amber coloured with a mild caramel aroma. Sweet toffee taste with grainy notes and some citrus hops. | |
| LEEK, Leek, Staffordshire | Staffordshire Bitter (4.2% ABV) | Amber with fruity aroma. Malty and hoppy start with the hoppy finish diminishing quickly. | |
| LODDON, Dunsden, Berkshire | Ferryman's Gold (4.4% ABV) | Golden, smooth body with masses of zesty, aromatic Styrian Goldings. | |
| MALVERN HILLS, Great Malvern, Worcestershire | Black Pear (4.4% ABV) | A sharp citrus hoppiness is the main constituent of this golden brew that has a long, dry aftertaste. | |
| MARSTON MOOR, York | Matchlock Mild (4.0% ABV) | A traditional mild, apparently brewed by the Rudgate brewery for Marston Moor! | |
| MAYFIELDS, Bishops Cleeve, Worcestershire | Conqueror (4.3% ABV) | A new beer from the brothers James and Thomas Lewis; like all their brews this uses hops grown on their own farm. | |
| MIGHTY OAK, Maldon, Essex | English Oak (4.8% ABV) | Copper-coloured strong bitter with a full body dominated by malt and a reasonable level of bitterness. The hoppy aroma also has trace of vanilla. | |
| MIGHTY OAK, Maldon, Essex | Maldon Gold (3.8% ABV) | Honey and bubblegum dominate the aroma of this fruity golden ale. Sweet pineapple in the taste yields to a drier hop, malt balanced finish. | |
| MILESTONE, Newark, Nottinghamshire | Hoptimism (3.6% ABV) | A light refreshing session bitter that was first brewed to raise money for the Asian Tsunami Appeal via the Red Cross. | |
| MILLSTONE, Mossley, Gtr. Manchester | Windy Miller (4.1% ABV) | A refreshingly bitter beer. Pale in colour crisp hoppy aromas accompany a seriously bitter taste. | |
| MILTON, Milton, Cambridgeshire | Nero's Stout (5.0% ABV) | A deeply flavoured oat stout, one of the blackest beers around with a remarkable amount of flavour. | |

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| OAKHAM, Peterborough, Cambridgeshire. | JHB (3.8% ABV) | A straw-coloured bitter with a powerful hoppy aroma, a flurry of fruity hops with building bitterness in the mouth ending with surging dryness. | |
| OAKLEAF, Gosport, Hampshire | Blakes Gosport Bitter (5.2% ABV) | Packed with berry fruits and roast, this old ale is almost Belgian in style with a superb hoppy bitterness and building sweetness. Vinous finish. | |
| OAKLEAF, Gosport, Hampshire | Heart of Oak (4.5% ABV) | Initial strong fruity hop flavours lead to a bittersweet aroma balanced by a warm chocolatey finish. First brewed for Trafalgar bi-centenary. | |
| OAKLEAF, Gosport, Hampshire | Oakleaf Bitter (3.8% ABV) | A pale brown beer with with hoppy and malty aroma that leads to an intensely hoppy and bitter flavour, with balancing fruit and long, dry finish. | |
| OHANLON'S, Whimple, Devon | Yellowhammer (4.0% ABV) | Well-balanced, smooth pale yellow beer with a predominant hop and fruit nose and taste, leading to a dry, bitter finish. | |
| OKELLS, Douglas, Isle of Man | Maclir (4.4% ABV) | Resiny hops and lemon fruit in the aroma, banana and lemon in the taste and a big bitter finish, dominated by hops, juicy malt and citrus fruit. | |
| OSSETT, Ossett, West Yorkshire | Fine Fettle (4.8% ABV) | A strong yet refreshing pale ale with a crisp clean flavour and citrus fruity aroma. | |
| OSSETT, Ossett, West Yorkshire | Silver King (4.3% ABV) | A lager-style beer with a crisp, dry flavour and citrus fruity aroma. | |
| PHOENIX, Heywood, Gtr. Manchester | Arizona (4.1% ABV) | Yellow in colour with a fruity and hoppy aroma. A refreshing beer with citrus, hop and good bitterness, and shortish dry finish. | |
| PICTISH, Rochdale, Gtr. Manchester | Alchemist Ale (4.3% ABV) | A refreshing straw-coloured ale with crisp malt flavours and a robust hoppy finish. | |
| PLASSEY, Eyton, Wrexham | Fusilier (4.5% ABV) | A full-bodied bitter. Very smooth with big malty flavour and good hop aroma. Regimental beer of the Royal Welch Fusiliers. | |
| RAMSBOTTOM, Ramsbottom, Gtr. Manchester | Provident (4.5% ABV) | A straw-coloured beer, herbal/spice aromas lead to strong fruit flavours with a bitter finish. | |
| RAMSGATE, Ramsgate, Kent | Gadds No.7 Ramsgate Bitter (3.8% ABV) | Satisfying session bitter brewed using local Fuggies hops. | |

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| RING O' BELLS, Launceston, Cornwall | Bodmin Boar (4.3% ABV) | Apple and aromatic nose, heavy and fruity in the mouth with a long bitter finish. | |
| RODHAM'S, Otley, West Yorkshire | Bitter (3.5% ABV) | Produced by Michael Rodham in a one-barrel plant in the cellar of his house! | |
| ROOSTER'S, Knarborough, North Yorkshire | Drunken Duck (4.3% ABV) | A golden beer with a buttery and sweet lemon aroma. A sweet citrus and soft malt taste balanced with dry hopping. | |
| ROTHER VALLEY, Northiam, East Sussex | Level Best (4.0% ABV) | Full-bodied tawny session bitter with a malt and fruit aroma, malty taste and a dry, hoppy finish. | |
| SCATTOR ROCK, Christow, Devon | Dinger Tor (4.8% ABV) | A seasonal beer for March; one of the "Tor" collection brews. | |
| SHAW'S, Dunkinfield, Gtr. Manchester | Tame Valley (4.3% ABV) | A newish brew from the brewery based in stables of the former William Shaws Brewery (closed in 1941). | |
| SKINNERS, Truro, Cornwall | Betty Stogs (4.0% ABV) | Pleasant session beer with well-balanced hop and fruit in the taste, and a lasting bitter finish. | |
| SKINNERS, Truro, Cornwall | Cornish Blonde (5.0% ABV) | A combination of wheat malt, and English and American hops makes this light-coloured wheat beer deceptively easy to drink. | |
| SPINNING DOG, Hereford | Hereford Organic Bitter (3.7% ABV) | A light, easy drinking organic beer. Supreme Champion SIBA Western Region 2005. | |
| STEWART, Loanhead, Lothian | Edinburgh Gold (4.8% ABV) | Refreshing, balanced and full of flavour. This golden beer has a continental hop aroma with moderate bitterness and pleasing smooth finish. | |
| STONEHENGE, Netheravon, Wiltshire | Sign of Spring (4.6% ABV) | Green-coloured; smooth and drinkable, rich in malt/hop aroma. | |
| SURREY HILLS, Shere, Surrey | Shere Drop (4.2% ABV) | Pale in colour with a hint of grapefruit and lemon in the aroma. The hop bitterness is complemented by a balancing malt. Long, moderately dry finish. | |
| SUTHWYK, Fareham, Hampshire | Skew Sunshine Ale (4.6% ABV) | Lightly malted Suthwyk barley and Challenger hops create a fresh beer, pale colour with citrus flavour, light in bitterness. | |
| SWAN, West Peckham, Kent. | Bewick (5.3% ABV) | Swan's heavyweight premium bitter. Hopped with UK Target for bite and Kentish Goldings for aroma. | |

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| SWAN, West Peckham, Kent. | Fuggles Pale (3.6% ABV) | A session bitter, traditionally hoppy, using local Fuggles hops. | |
| TINDALL, Norwich, Norfolk | Alltime (4.0% ABV) | Well-balanced, traditional English bitter. Hops and malt are reflected in both the bouquet and taste. Bitterness increases in the long finish. | |
| TINDALL, Norwich, Norfolk | Norfolk N Good (4.6% ABV) | A golden-hued brew with lemonade air's. Citrus notes provided by the hop/malt blend. Some bitterness creeps into lingering complex finish. | |
| TIPPLES, Acle, Norfolk | Moonrocket (5.0% ABV) | A strong pale ale; Strong hoppy aroma and fresh on the nose. Clean and crisp flavour with a dryish, citrusy finish. | |
| TIPPLES, Acle, Norfolk | Red Head (4.2% ABV) | A traditional bitter; bright reddish/amber in colour with a nutty malt flavour and good hoppy aroma and a nice bitter finish. | |
| TITANIC, Burslem, Staffordshire | Mild (3.5% ABV) | Roast and malt aroma in this red-brown ale. Hops give a dry finish after a smooth, sweet body. | |
| TITANIC, Burslem, Staffordshire | Iceberg (4.1% ABV) | Gold coloured, with a hoppy and fruity aroma leading to a fruity and hoppy taste with tones of honey and grass. Bitterness grows in finish. | |
| TOWER, Burton upon Trent, Staffordshire | Pale Ale (4.8% ABV) | Orange/amber coloured beer with a slightly sweet aroma. Taste is balanced with good hoppy flavours and some caramel. Short dry finish. | |
| TRING, Tring, Hertfordshire. | Jack O'Legs (4.2% ABV) | A combination of four types of malt and two types of aroma hop provide a copper-coloured premium ale with full fruit a hoppy bitterness. | |
| TRIPLE fff, Four Marks, Hampshire | Gilbert White (6.0% ABV) | | |
| TRIPLE fff, Four Marks, Hampshire | Moondance (4.2% ABV) | Amber best bitter, wonderfully hopped, with a citrus hop nose, balanced by a bitterness and dryness in the mouth. Bitterness increases in the finish. | |
| TRYST, Larbert, Stirlingshire | Brockville Dark (3.8% ABV) | A dark mild with a sweet coffee aroma. A complex range of flavours with a long dark tangy finish. | |
| UPPER AGRIBIGG, Honley, West Yorkshire | Premium (4.5% ABV) | A copper coloured bitter with a smooth malty and fruity aroma and taste. | |

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

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| VALHALLA, Baltasound, Shetland | Old Scatness (4.0% ABV) | A yellow-coloured beer with a fruity aroma with notes of malt and grain. A malt/fruit flavour with a bitter finish. | |
| TOMAS WATKIN, Swansea | Crrw Braf (3.7% ABV) | A clean-drinking amber-coloured ale with a light bitterness and gentle hop aroma. | |
| WAVENEY, Earsham, Norfolk | Lightweight (3.8% ABV) | This has a light but well-balanced hop and malt character, with a quick bitter finish. Golden hued with a distinctive strawberry and cream nose. | |
| WESSEX, Warminster, Wiltshire. | Crocketon Classic (4.1% ABV) | Full bodied, lawny, full flavoured, bitter, fruity and malty. | |
| WESTERHAM, Edenbridge, Kent | Black Eagle Special Pale Ale (3.8% ABV) | Golden in colour with a biscuity malt and tangy hop character; provided by First Gold and Cascade hops. | |
| WHALEBONE, Wincolmllee, East Yorkshire | Neck Oil Bitter (3.9% ABV) | A budget-priced bitter brewed using 2 English malts and 3 English hop varieties. | |
| WHITE HORSE, Stanford in the Vale, Oxfordshire | Wayland Smithy (4.4% ABV) | Deep red at its heart; and balanced with buckets of aromatic hops. | |
| WHITE STAR, Northam, Hampshire. | Dark Destroyer (4.7% ABV) | Roasted malts produce a rich, dark ale blended with English hops. A good thirst quencher. | |
