Brewery	Beer	Tasting notes	Your notes
ABBEYDALE, Sheffield, South Yorkshire	Absolution (5.3% ABV)	A strong pale sweetish beer. Light in body but with plenty of flavour.	
BATEMANS, Wainfleet All Saints, Lincolnshire	Dark Mild (3.0% ABV)	Orchard fruit and roast nut aroma with hops evident with a lasting bitter finish. One of the classic mild ales; a ruby-black gem.	
CHERITON, Cheriton, Hampshire	Village Elder (3.8% ABV)	A straw-coloured session bitter brew with elderflowers that provide a light fruity flavour balanced by a notable hoppiness and bitter-sweet finish.	
CROUCH VALE, South Woodham Ferrers, Essex	Brewers Gold (4.0% ABV)	Honey-toned golden ale, with grapefruit sharpness offset by suggestions of melon and pineapple.	
HARVIESTOUN, Alva, Clackmannanshire	Bitter & Twisted (3.8% ABV)	Refreshingly hoppy beer with fruit throughout. A bitter-sweet taste with a long bitter finish. A golden session beer.	
HOGS BACK, Tongham, Surrey	T.E.A (4.2% ABV)	A pale brown best bitter with both malt and hops prominent in the nose. With a well-rounded bitter flavour, balanced with fruit. A hoppy finish.	
MOORHOUSES, Pendle, Lancashire.	Black Cat (3.4% ABV)	A dark complex mild with a faint roast coffee aroma. Roast liquorice and fruit flavours predominate over a malty base. The finish is quite bitter.	
OAKHAM, Peterborough, Cambridgeshire.	JHB (3.8% ABV)	A straw-coloured bitter with a powerful hoppy aroma, a flurry of fruity hops with building bitterness in the mouth ending with surging dryness.	
OAKLEAF, Gosport, Hampshire	Can't Believe it's Not Bitter (4.9% ABV)	An English leger made from only the best pale and roasted "Optica" malt, Slovakian Saaz hops bottom-fermenting yeast.	
WOODFORDE S, Woodbastwick, Norfolk	Wherry Best Bitter (3.8% ABV)	A complex explosion of aroma and flavour in this amber brew. Hops dominate with citrus support, low key malt balances a long dry finish.
